Feedback Analysis

Every year we take feedback manually from the students. since this year we have introduced online feedback system. Each student gives feedback of their respective teachers on 5 point scale. A committee constituted by the head of the institution goes through these feedback forms and gives report card to the teachers which help them to know present position and scope for their improvement. Students' expectations are more and changing with the time. They want their teachers to be more update as far as technology is concerned. A. Title of the practice: 'Research Motivation to Students'

2. Goal

The main objective of the practice is to motivate students to undertake research activities and nurture research culture among the students.

3. The context

Students entering at UG level especially in rural areas are far away from research but their thinking power is tremendous therefore different projects, surveys, local problems are given to them which will be helpful to attract them towards the research. This activity has nurtured the research culture in the campus.

4. The practice

Students from our college are motivated to undertake research work in the form of Projects, Survey, Review, papers etc. Such research work is being presented in the competition at college level. The best research work, papers being selected and forwarded to the intercollegiate level competition. Their findings are presented in the Avishkar research festival as well as in the different conferences and published in the form of Research Papers.

5. Evidence of success

Through the motivation to the students for research, our students are able to participate in the Avishkar research festival every year. Students not only participate in the Avishkar but they have ranked in this practice and presented themselves twice at Inter University level and several times at University level. There are seven publications of students published in reputed journals and they have presented papers in conferences also.

Students entering at UG level are poor in their language and communication skill. They are facing problems to cite references and to present papers/projects before the examiners.

B. Title of the Practice

'Best Teacher & Student of the year Award'

2. Goal

- To motivate faculties to contribute more in the development of the institution.
- To motivate Students for curricular and co-curricular development.

3. The context

'A pat on the back' always results in a positive way. By keeping this principal in view, the administration decided to begin the practice for students and teachers. It has always been confidence boosting and encouraging. These awards have been conferred on the teachers and students since back five years. This practice is being proved as motivational to teachers as well as students as they are performing better and better.

4. The practice

Initially this practice was started with best teacher award in 2009-10. It was later on extended to students. The college began this award for students from 2013-14. On the occasion of the annual gathering, 'Best teacher and Best student' awardees are selected in the IQAC meeting. Awards are given in the annual gathering every year. Since 2009-10, eight faculty members have been awarded with 'best teacher award' and thirteen students have been awarded with 'student of the year' award.

5. Evidence of success

These awards created a healthy competition among the teachers as well as students to be the best and resulted into the academic progress of the teachers & students. This award motivated teachers to work more and more in research, academic and extension activities. Students were also being motivated and they scored good number of marks in annual exams at UG & PG level. This contributed in the overall progress of the institution.

6. Problems encountered and resources required

Since the practice created the positive influence among the staff, each faculty is aspiring to have it. The rule of the practice is to choose only one faculty for each academic year. The IQAC sometimes feels very difficult to choose any one faculty for the award if the performance of the more than one faculty is excellent. Even students are very eager to have this award and feel dissatisfied when not selected for the award. Initially we used to select only one student for the award but later on the selection committee has to change the criteria and began to select one student from each faculty.
